US President Trump to attend roadshow, 'Howdy Modi'-like event in Ahmedabad

AHMEDABAD: US President Donald Trump, during his India visit, would participate in a grand roadshow in Ahmedabad and also tour the Sabarmati Ashram and inaugurate a newly-built cricket stadium here with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, sources said. He is likely to visit Ahmedabad on February 24, they said.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday said he is "extremely delighted" that Trump and his wife Melania will visit India later this month and added that they will be accorded a memorable welcome.

"Our nations are cooperating extensively on a wide range of issues. Robust friendship between our nations augurs well not only for our citizens but also for the entire world," he tweeted.

During his visit to Modi's home state Gujarat, Trump along with the Indian Prime Minister would participate in a grand roadshow, planned along a 10-km decked-up



stretch from the Ahmedabad airport to the Sabarmati Ashram, they said.

The US president would then visit the Sabarmati Ashram, which served as epicentre of the country's freedom struggle during Mahatma Gandhi stay there.

Trump and PM Modi would later inaugurate the newly-constructed Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel Stadium in the city's Motera area and address a gathering, likely to be attended by over one lakh people, the sources said.

The mega event at the stadium will be similar to the "Howdy, Modi!" event held in the US last year, they said.

PM Modi and Trump shared the stage at the "Howdy Modi!" gala event in Houston in September last year and addressed a record crowd of 50,000 Indian-Americans.

Citizens here have dubbed the upcoming visit of the US president at the Sardar Patel Stadium as "Kem Chho, Trump!" (Howdy Trump) event, the sources said.

The stadium at Motera has a seating capacity of 1.10 lakh, more than the Melbourne

Cricket Ground in Australia, an official earlier said.

The Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation has issued an order assigning duties to its officers for the roadshow preparations, the sources said.

The civic officials have been asked to arrange transportation and parking for those invited for the Motera stadium inauguration, they said.

The White House on Monday announced that Trump will visit India from February 24 to 25.

Earlier, Chinese President Xi Jinping, Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe and Israeli PM Benjamin Netanyahu were accorded a grand welcome in Ahmedabad during their visits between 2014 and 2018.

The three leaders had also visited the Sabarmati Ashram with Modi and paid respects to Mahatma Gandhi.

In view of the US president's upcoming visit to Ahmedabad, the Gujarat government on Tuesday rescheduled tabling of the state budget in the assembly to February 26.

40 lakh Assamese-speaking Muslims may get 'ethnic tribe' tag

GUWAHATI: The Assam government is likely to give "ethnic tribe" nomenclature to four groups of Assamese-speaking Muslims living in the Brahmaputra Valley who were earlier called indigenous Muslims. These people do not have any history of migration from erstwhile East Pakistan.

"We have proposed to replace 'indigenous' with 'ethnic tribe' because Assam so far has no official definition of who is an indigenous Assamese," said Assam minorities development board chairman Muminul Aowal. He added that the four communities - Gorias, Morias, Desis and tea tribe Jolha - are already recognized as more other backward classes (MOBC).

"They are about 40 lakh in number," said Aowal.

But the proposal has not included the Maimal group of Muslims, which are Bengali-speaking, in the "ethnic tribe"



Muslim community. "The Maimals are in the Barak Valley and the government will consider their case later. At this moment, we are talking of only those in Brahmaputra Valley," Aowal added.

migrant Muslims. The Gorias and Morias worked for the Ahom kings and the Desis were originally Koch-Rajbongshis who converted to Islam. Those following Islam among the people brought by the British from the Chota Nagpur plateau to work in tea gardens comprise the tea tribe Jolha."

The new nomenclature now awaits the approval of the chief minister and will be done before the start of the socio-economic census. Aowal said the Census operation to be carried out by state home and minority welfare department will be completed before the next assembly election due early next year.

The migrant Bengali-speaking Muslims, which comprise more than 63% of the state's total Muslim population, have always been the block around which electoral battles have been fought in the state.

These group of Muslims trace their lineage to the 15th century and majority of them took to Islam by conversion between 13 and 17th century, Aowal said, adding, "None of these groups can be called

Huge win in Delhi ensures AAP its Rajya Sabha presence till January, 2030

NEW DELHI: Getting a huge number of seats in Delhi Assembly means the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) will get all three Rajya Sabha seats from the Capital city for the second time and ensure its presence in the Upper House till January 2030.

Though the election to Rajya Sabha seats from the city is due only in January 2024 when the incumbent three AAP members retire, the poor show of BJP in Assembly polls won't get the party even a single seat in Upper House from Delhi.

Under a formula to win a Rajya Sabha from Delhi, any political party would require minimum 19 MLAs in the Assembly to secure a single seat. With the BJP being not near this number, the AAP will bag all the three seats like what it did in January 2018.

Currently, the AAP has Sanjay Singh, Sushil Kumar Gupta and Narain Dass Gupta as its MPs in the Upper House where the ruling NDA has long been struggling with majority mark on its own.



Though the BJP has improved its Rajya Sabha tally over the past four years and became the largest party in the Upper House with 82 members on board, its journey to majority mark was halted by the party's defeat in Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh.

Still, the NDA could manage crucial bills including the Citizenship (Amendment) Bill in the House with the support of friendly parties such as BJD, YSRCP and AIDMK.

With three MPs on board, the AAP currently has more members in the House than many political parties such as TDP, YSRCP, CPI and PDP.

The BJP is, however, expected to gain good numbers, especially from Uttar Pradesh, when the Upper House will go for biennial polls in March-April. Over 70 seats will go vacant

in Rajya Sabha this year. Uttar Pradesh, where the BJP has a huge tally in Assembly, alone will see 10 vacancies.

Congress had garnered 20,135 votes but this time three-time Congress MLA Parvez Hashmi got just 5,107 votes. In the Muslim-dominated Okhla constituency, Khan got 66% vote share, while the once popular Congress got just 2.5%!

Okhla is important as Shaheen Bagh, epicentre of the protests against the anti-Citizenship Amendment Act, is part of the constituency. While AAP focused on the development plank, Shaheen Bagh was used as a polarising plank by BJP across the city. AAP didn't take a clear stand on the anti-CAA protests and kept a safe distance from Shaheen Bagh while Congress was vocal against CAA and NRC. In its manifesto, Congress had promised to pass a resolution in Delhi Assembly against CAA and ask the central government to withdraw it. It had also promised that if it came to power.

NEW DELHI: Delhi's Muslims have traditionally voted for Congress but shifted allegiance to the fledgling AAP in 2013. The support, which became more pronounced in 2015, appears to have become absolute now. On Tuesday, as results of the 2020 Delhi Assembly elections were announced, this was most glaringly evident at Okhla.

AAP's Amanatullah Khan, who received more than 1.3 lakh votes, defeated BJP's Braham Singh by a margin of 71,827 votes, one of the biggest in this election. In the 2015 Delhi Assembly elections, Khan had defeated Singh by a margin of 64,532. While the margin by which Khan had won last time was also huge, the biggest difference has been in the fortunes of Congress.

LPG price hiked by Rs 144.5 per cylinder

NEW DELHI: Cooking gas LPG price on Wednesday was hiked by a steep Rs 144.5 per cylinder due to spurt in benchmark global rates of the fuel.

But to insulate domestic users, the government almost doubled the subsidy it provides on the fuel to keep per cylinder outgo almost unchanged.

LPG price was increased to

Rs 858.50 per 14.2 kg cylinder from Rs 714 previously, according to a price notification of state-owned oil firms.

This is the steepest hike in rates since January 2014 when prices had gone up by Rs 220 per cylinder to Rs 1,241.

Domestic LPG users, who are entitled to buy 12 bottles of 14.2-kg each at subsidised rates in a year, will get more

subsidy. The government subsidy payout to domestic users has been increased from Rs 153.86 per cylinder to Rs 291.48, industry officials said.

For Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana (PMUY) beneficiaries, the subsidy has increased from Rs 174.86 to Rs 312.48 per cylinder.

After accounting for the

subsidy that is paid directly into the bank accounts of LPG users, a 14.2-kg cylinder would cost Rs 567.02 for domestic users and Rs 546.02 for PMUY users.

The government gave out 8 crore free LPG connections to poor women under PMUY to increase coverage of environment-friendly fuel in kitchens.
